NVICities

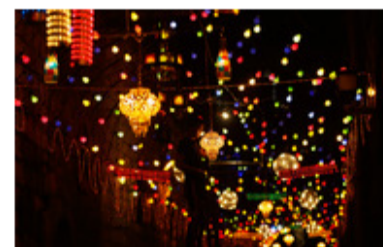
