



Internship

The International Criminal Law Network (ICLN) aims to facilitate social and professional contact between legal professionals, academic experts and policymakers in international criminal law. To do this ICLN annually organises four informal meetings and newsletters for its members. Additionally, ICLN organises various conferences, tours of The Hague's law related organisations and international criminal law related courses. As a young, dynamic organisation ICLN is always looking to expand its activities and for new opportunities to create more interaction in the field of international criminal law.

ICLN was founded in June 2002. It is part of, Science Alliance, a private institution specialising in the creation of networks between academics and practice.
