

World Teachers Summer School & Advanced Programme



New training programmes for new needs

Schools are increasingly moving towards teaching in an international setting with the English language as lingua franca. This process requires a new set of teaching skills even for experienced teachers. ICLON Leiden University School of Teaching and Wolfert van Borselen School Group in Rotterdam have recognised this development and have responded to the challenge of designing an in-service post-graduate training programme that provides teachers with the skills they need.

World Teachers Summer School and Advanced Programme

ICLON and Wolfert van Borselen proudly present the **second edition** of the *World Teachers Summer School* and *Advanced Programme*, aimed at subject and language teachers who wish to develop their CLIL skills (Content and Language Integrated Learning) in the classroom. The in-service *World Teachers Summer School* and the complementary *Advanced Programme* focus on the methodology of bilingual and/or international education and the knowledge and skills teachers need to teach in these schools. The programmes are based on the practical application of theory and work from real-life teaching situations, case-studies, activities and approaches that have been intensively tested during pre- and in-service trainings.

The *World Teachers Advanced Programme* is the continuation of the *World Teachers Summer School* and provides an in-depth approach to CLIL. Participants receive the opportunity to further explore issues and topics particularly relevant to them and to share experiences with colleagues.

Target group

Qualified secondary school subject and language teachers currently teaching in bilingual or international education or intending to do so in the future.

Learning objectives

The learning objectives of these programmes are:

- Develop knowledge of the most widely recognized methodological CLIL principles
- Develop skills to implement CLIL methodology
- Develop ideas and strategies to design CLIL teaching materials
- Develop knowledge of interlinguistic skills and of teaching in international classrooms
- Gain awareness of third culture kids, and of gifted and talented pupils in international and bilingual classrooms.

Requirements

- Participants should be qualified teachers (secondary education)
- A command of English at B2 level of the Common European Framework is required.

World Teachers Advanced Programme

Period: October 2010 through May 2011

Programme

The *Advanced Programme* builds on the *Summer School* topics and creates opportunities for *Summer School* participants to set their own learning goals and improve their CLIL skills through coaching and self-study. The *Advanced Programme* consists of on-the-job coaching and/or e-coaching, self-study, and afternoon meetings in October, January and April of 2010/11 in Leiden; scheduling will depend on the participants. If possible, each participant will receive a lesson visit and personal coaching on the job. The presentation and certification ceremony will be held in May 2011.

Workload

About 150 hours of work (Dutch: *studielasturen*), self-study included.

Costs

Summer School: course fee: € 1500 (coffee/tea, lunches, afternoon drinks and two evening meals included).

Summer School and Advanced Programme: course fee: € 3500.

Course material: € 75 (including a copy of *CLIL Skills*, € 40).
